- 1. All electrical distribution <u>switches</u> and controls should be clearly <u>marked</u> to indicate the machinery or equipment that they serve.
- 2. <u>Flammable</u> material should not be stored or placed in proximity to electrical equipment.
- Metal ladders, or wire-reinforced wooden ladders, should <u>not</u> be used in <u>proximity</u> to energized electrical equipment.
- 4. All electrical tools and equipment must be grounded or **double** insulated.
- 5. Extension cords should only be used for <u>temporary</u> service and should be maintained in good condition. They should be routinely <u>inspected</u> for frayed, torn or split cords and damaged plugs or connectors. All damaged cords must be <u>repaired</u> or <u>replaced</u> immediately.
- 6. Avoid using electrical tools and equipment in or around <u>damp</u> or <u>wet</u> areas.
- 7. Defective electrical equipment must be immediately <u>reported</u> to your teacher.
- 8. Never replace a blown fuse with a larger capacity fuse.
